A Resolution Authorizing the Submittal of an Application, for an Urban & Community Forestry Grant Program of the Arkansas Department of Agriculture's Forestry Division (Urban Forestry)

WHEREAS; the City of Cotter shall apply for 50-50 match for funds through Arkansas Department of Agriculture Forestry Division.

WHEREAS; the City Council of Cotter, Arkansas has determined there is a need for trimming sixty-six (66) trees and removing two (2) dead trees with trimming in Big Spring Park and Warrior Park.

**WHEREAS;** the Cotter Tree Advisory Board shall make application for up to \$12,000 Grant with a \$2,000 match from the Cotter 2023 budget with an additional match of \$10,000 from volunteers in kind labor, equipment, and materials.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** the City of Cotter, Arkansas, hereby authorizes the Mayor of Cotter to submit an application for grant funding from the Arkansas Department of Agriculture's Forestry Division.


